# **REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS**

### Another good year

Unlike last year, the sun is not shining on the UK, and the wind is not blowing. These periods of high pressure are a challenge to the objective of zero carbon generation when the grid needs turn to higher carbon fuels like gas, or rely on nuclear.

Nevertheless, over the whole of 2020, UK low carbon electricity hit record highs. Fossil fuel production fell to an all-time low of 42%, whilst at the same time low-carbon electricity generation rose to a record high of 57.5%. That's according to official BEIS figures, which suggest wind, solar and bio-energy recorded increases ranging between 5% and 20%. The report also suggests primary energy consumption across the UK on a fuel input basis declined by 11% in the last quarter of 2020.

In the four years from first generation in November 2016, Southill has generated a total of 18,227 MWh, and saved 10,280 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>. At a time of climate emergency, and given the climate emergency declaration made by Charlbury Town Council in November 2019, Southill is a meaningful contribution to the changes that we need to see.

### Financial performance

Our solar array had its best ever year of output in 2020. We produced 4,774 MWh of electricity which is 14% above our projected output and 5% above our average annual output to date. Although there have been drops in the value of both the electricity we export and the Renewable Obligation Certificates we create, our overall surplus has remained healthy at £81,693.

The board is therefore recommending to members that 5% interest be paid. This level of surplus also means that the maximum 'Section 106' payments related to the planning consent are triggered, with £15,000 payable to the Cotswolds Conservation Board, and a community benefit pot of £30,000 available for distribution to environmental projects via Sustainable Charlbury.

Repayments to our bondholders were made in full and as projected.

## Distribution of community benefit

Sustainable Charlbury has now approved the first payments from our community fund. They are:

- £5,000 to Westmill Sustainable Energy Trust (WeSET), towards their new educational centre, with a further £5,000 promised for 2021/2 should it be required
- £5,000 to The Kitchen Garden People, towards the purchase of two new poly-tunnels
- £2,600 to the Nature stream of the town council's Environment Working Group towards the creation of carbon maps for a range of land use types

We also started working with Charlbury Bowls Club to make their existing building and new extension zero carbon.

### Refinancing

We're happy to announce that our refinancing is now complete. West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC) has provided us with a single loan to replace the three loans we previously had from Close Brothers, The Phone Co-op and WODC themselves. The new loan is at a substantially lower rate of interest than any of the previous loans, reducing our annual interest payments by around a quarter.

#### Power purchase agreement

During the year we were offered the chance to leave our contract with Co-op Energy early. We carried out a tender exercise to seek the best value for the society, considering offers from several providers. The winners were EDF with whom we have signed a new 1-year power purchase agreement. Although wholesale prices remain low, this agreement gives us a better price than was offered by our previous off-taker, and a higher proportion of the value of our Renewable Obligation Certificates.

## **Projections**

The solar farm continues to perform very well, exceeding the projected outcomes every year since it was installed. However, wholesale electricity prices remain low, as do the value of Renewable Obligation Certificates, so this is likely to mean somewhat lower income over the next few years.

There will also be an accounting adjustment because we paid back our Close Brothers loan early – meaning that the upfront loan fees which were due to be spread over the remaining years of the loan will all appear as an expense in our next accounts. So be prepared for our reported surplus to be lower next year even though our overall financials are in good shape.

### And the field grew greener....

Work on improving biodiversity on site continued according to plan, under the management of Guy Parker of <u>Wychwood Biodiversity</u> and Anne Miller who is organising community volunteers to keep down the weeds.

Deer are wildlife too and very partial to new tree growth. So several work parties were organised over the winter months (Covid restrictions allowing) to install much better tree guards with wooden posts and wire. It won't be too long hopefully before we see some fruit.

We also received grants from Coop Energy and the Cotswold Conservation Board which we will use to install fixed sheep fencing and a dew pond. Next year should see pictures of sheep grazing various parts of the field.

# Website update
