DIRECTORS' REPORT

When we met at last year's AGM, which of us foresaw the coming storm of the invasion of Ukraine and the impact on energy prices all over the world? Or the economic disruption that has ensued and the resulting hardship on consumers.

Hard as it is to acknowledge, Southill too can expect to be a beneficiary of higher prices. Whilst the price we were paid for our energy in the financial year 2022 had been contracted before the rises, the new contract which took effect from November will likely lead to a big increase in our surpluses. We will be thinking hard over this coming year about how to deploy these to best effect.

The year saw sunny weather, once again meaning that generation exceeded our expectations. The board has also made cost reductions. Consolidation of our borrowings with WODC means that the cost of servicing our loans has reduced. Solar Century, that had been providing Operations & Maintenance for the site since it was built, was sold to the Norwegian company Statkraft and dropped out of the O&M market. We have since contracted with LightsourceBP and our new O&M contractors are bedding in nicely.

Cash generation has also been very positive.

Consistent with the improved operating performance and cash generation the board is recommending payment of interest to members at 5%, in line with the previous year. We also anticipate we will be able to meet our commitment to repay our bondholders in full this year without having to increase our borrowings.

The Section 106 payments related to the planning consent are triggered at the level of £45k, of which £15k to goes to Cotswolds National Landscape, and £30k to community benefits to be distributed by Sustainable Charlbury.

An effect of the energy crisis has been the drive to use energy more efficiently and to invest in renewables at a much accelerated rate, both in the UK and globally. Locally, Charlbury is within a few miles of a proposal for an 840MW solar farm known as Botley West. Because Southill Solar is recognised as an exemplar for community involvement, for biodiversity and for land management, we have been approached by residents from Long Hanborough, by the Blenheim Estate, and by the solar farm developer – all looking to learn from our successes.

All our visitors have been keen to know whether we graze sheep under the panels and elsewhere in the field, and we believe that we are in a position to start this very shortly. A new fence secures a paddock towards the southern end of the field, and LightsourceBP has ensured that the electrics are safe from inquisitive jaws.

NOMINATIONS TO THE BOARD

The Rules of the Society state that there must be a minimum of three Board Members. There is no maximum. The Rules require at least one third of the Board Members to retire each year in rotation (they may seek re-election if they wish). Richard Slark and Tom Johnstone will be stepping down and will stand for re-election.

Retiring Directors Seeking Re-election

Richard Slark, Director

Richard Slark is an energy economist who brings a wealth of commercial experience garnered from advising renewable generators on price, policy and regulatory risk in electricity markets around the world. Richard has served on the board of Southill Community Energy since 2017 and stands for reelection.

Richard is a partner at Alvarez & Marsal where he leads the European energy disputes team. He has over 25 years' experience in energy and regulatory economics and a deep sector knowledge of electricity markets. Richard specialises facilitating investment in, and the effective operation of, renewable generation. Prior to joining A&M in 2019, Richard was director of the generation and renewables consulting practices at AFRY (formerly ILEX and Pöyry Management Consulting), based in Oxford. He developed and led the renewable energy team providing market, commercial, regulatory due diligence advice to M&A and financing transactions of offshore/onshore wind, solar, bioenergy waste-to-energy, hydro and other renewable and conventional generation assets across European markets.

Richard started his career as an economist with the UK electricity regulator (now Ofgem), working on competition issues; renewable support auctions; and price control reviews of transmission, distribution and supply businesses.

Richard has an MSc in Environmental Management and an honours degree in Economics. He lives locally in Cleveley and commutes regularly from Charlbury.

Tom Johnstone, Director

Tom Johnstone is a CIMA qualified accountant with over 35 years' experience working in industry in various different sectors. Over that time, he has been able to gain a wide range of accountancy experience from day to day running of business, acquisitions and disposals, financing and refinancing of business.

Tom is a Member of Southill Community Energy and has a personal interest in solar energy. Tom became involved in the project and was nominated as a director in September of 2016. Tom has found that the skills gained in the commercial world have transferred across into the renewable energy sector and should continue to do so as the project develops.
